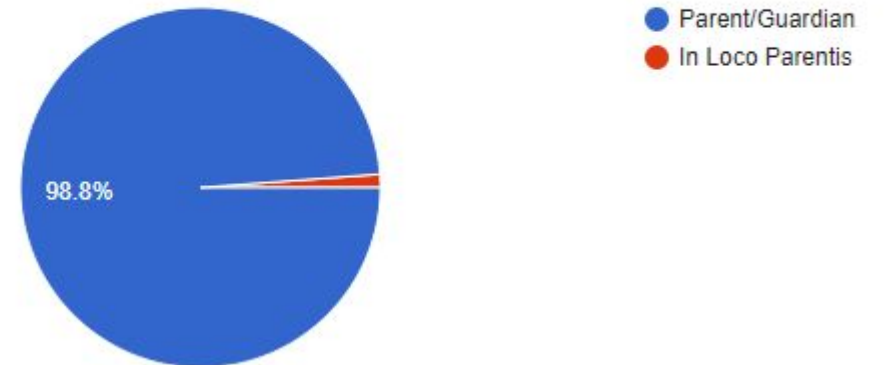

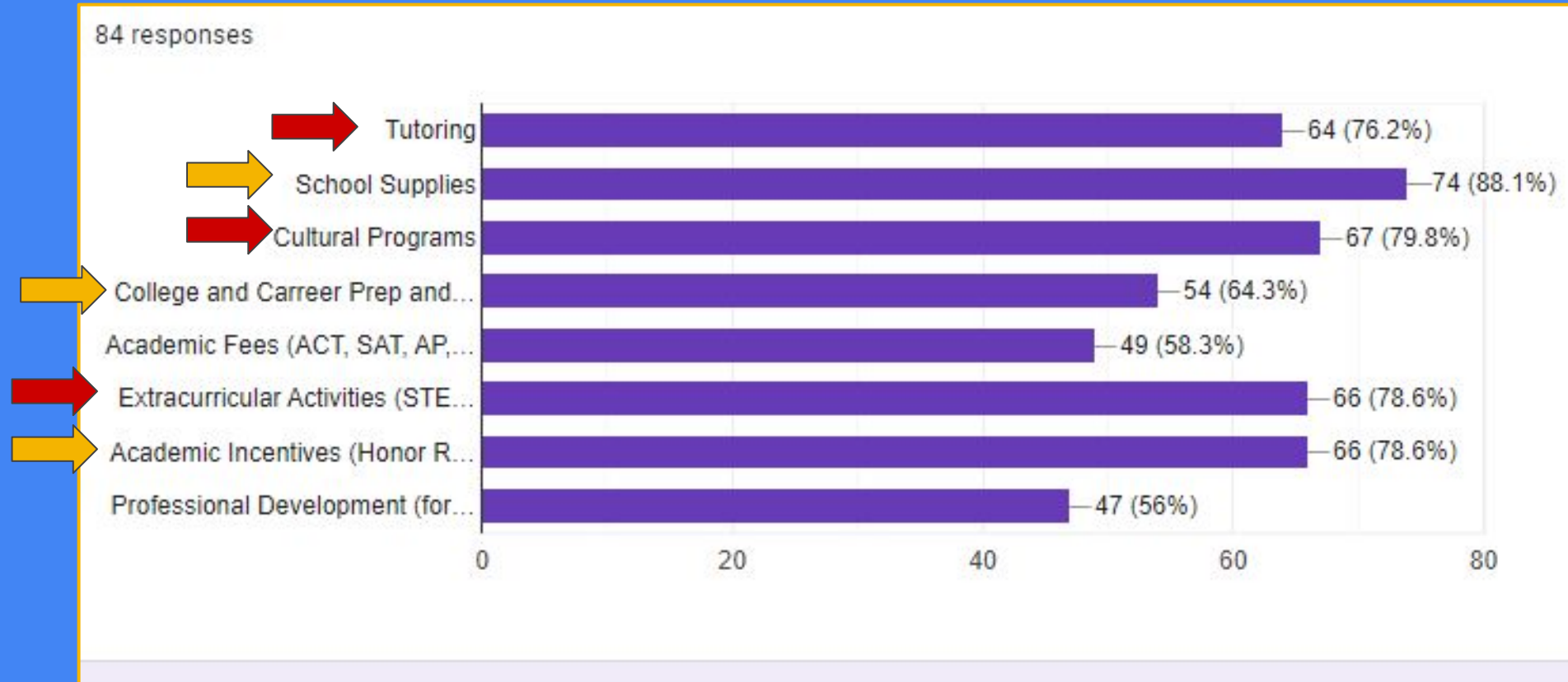

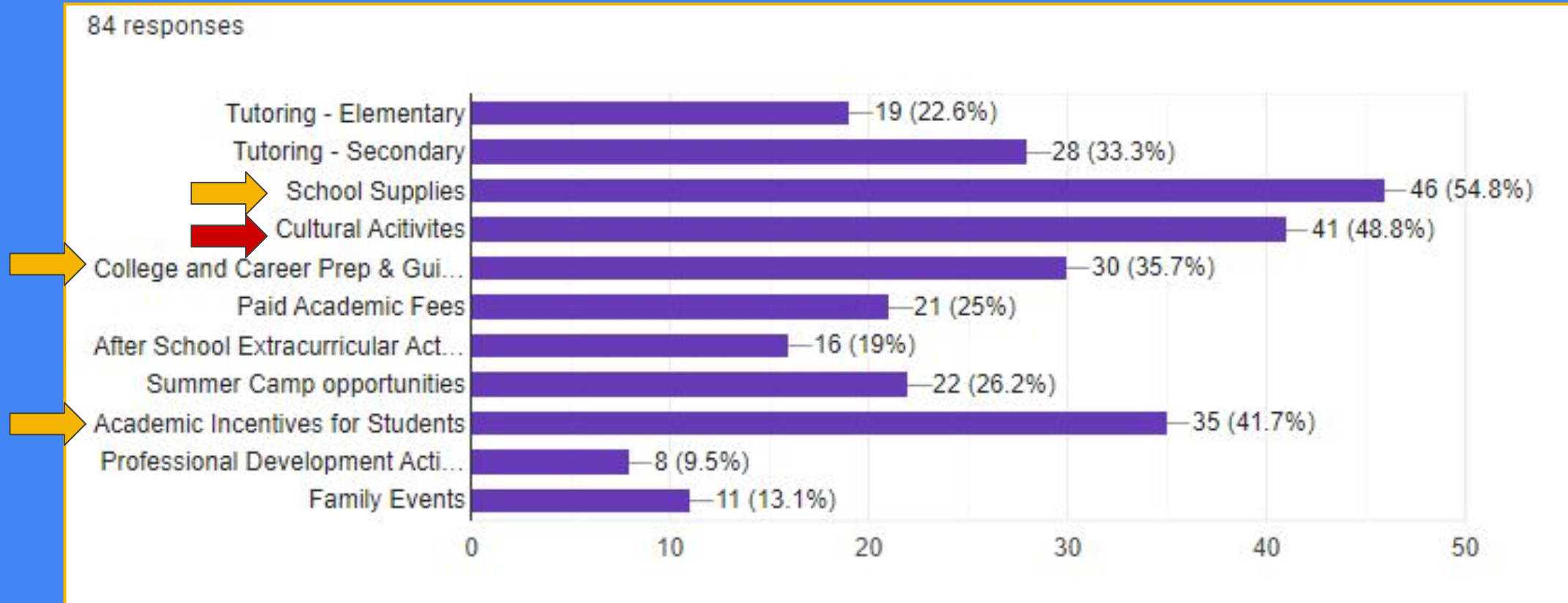


Please select any and all needs and services you think would benefit the Berryhill Johnson O'Malley Program:

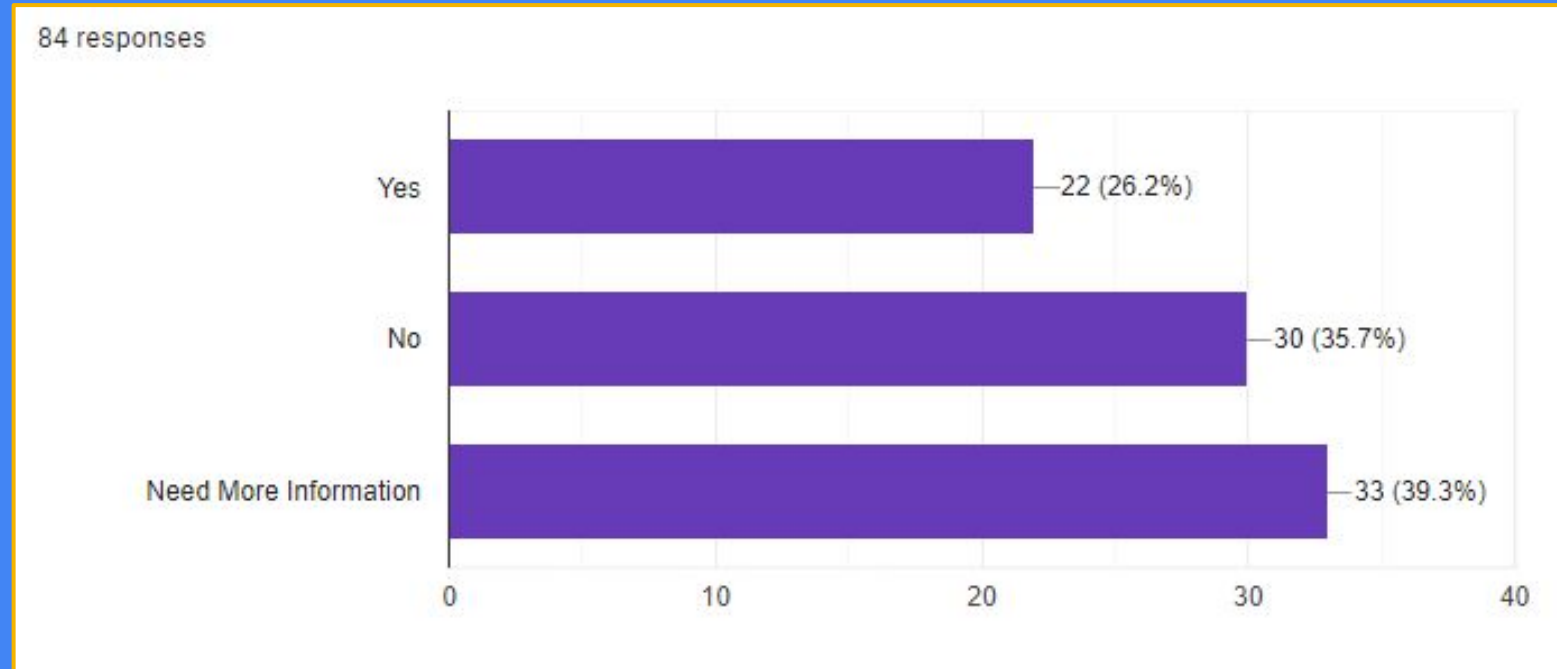

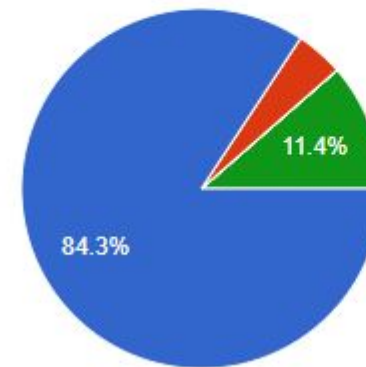

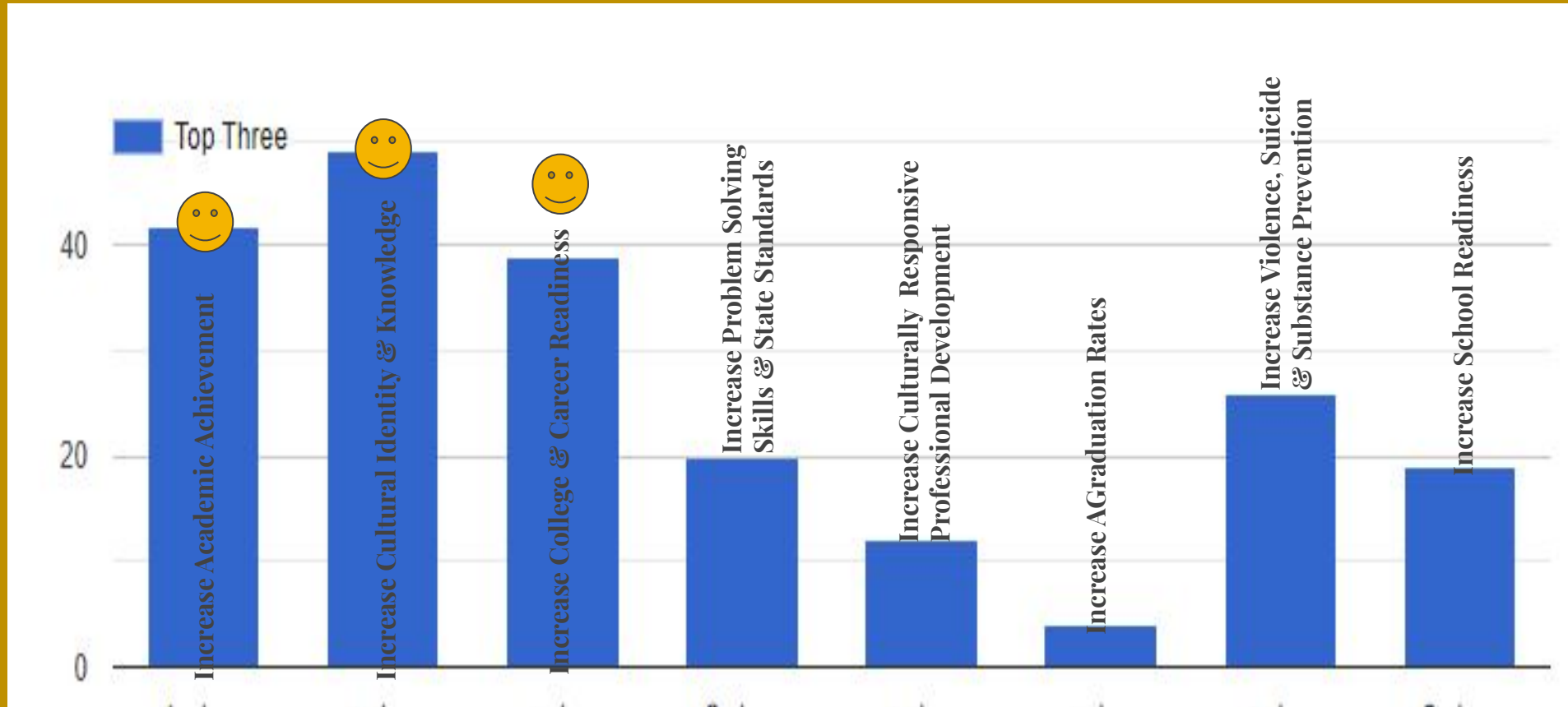

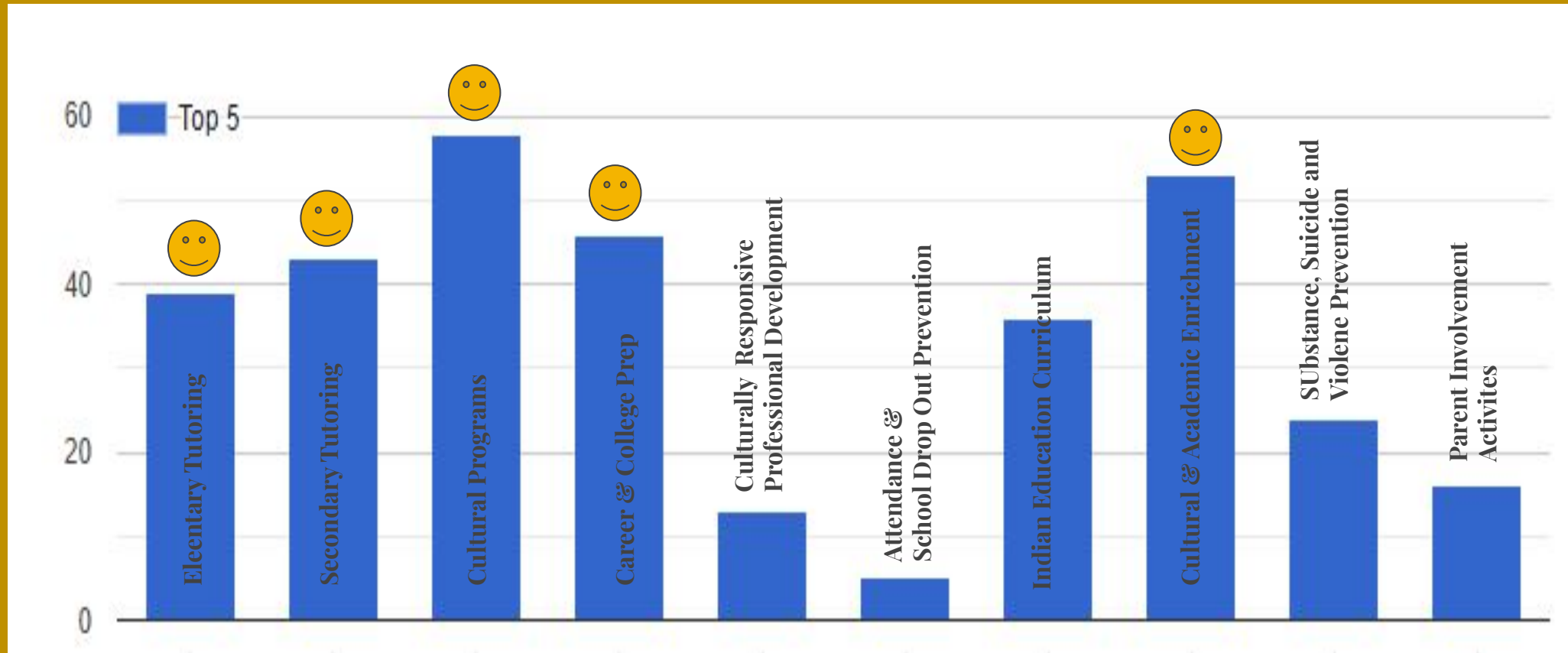

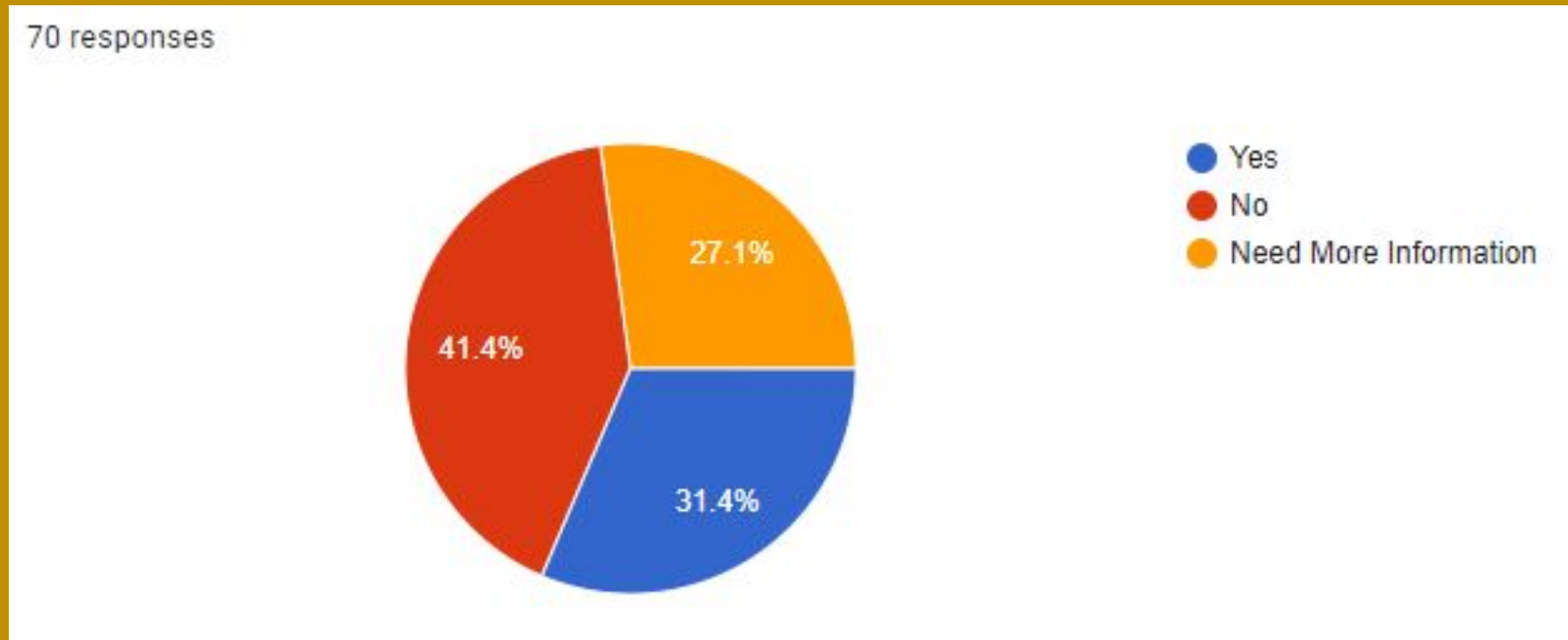

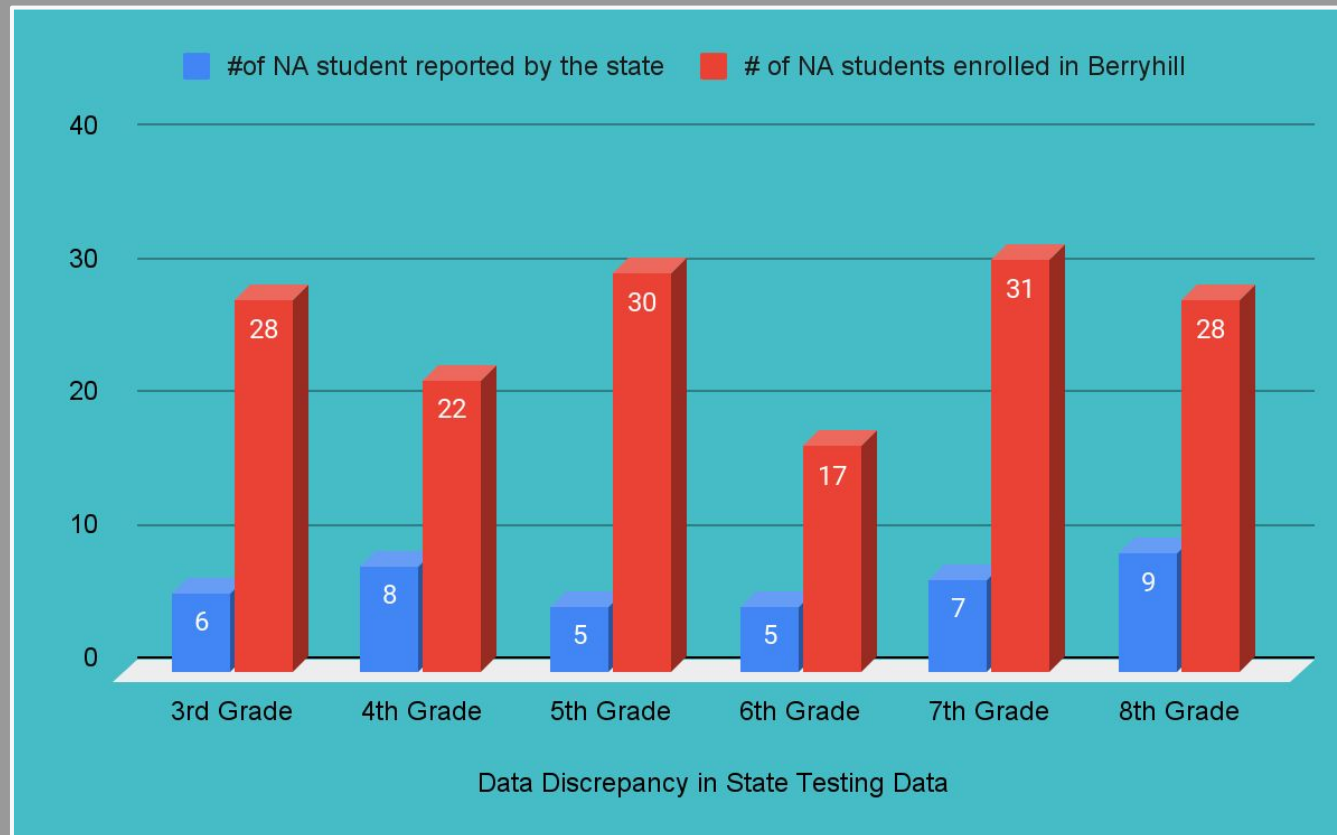

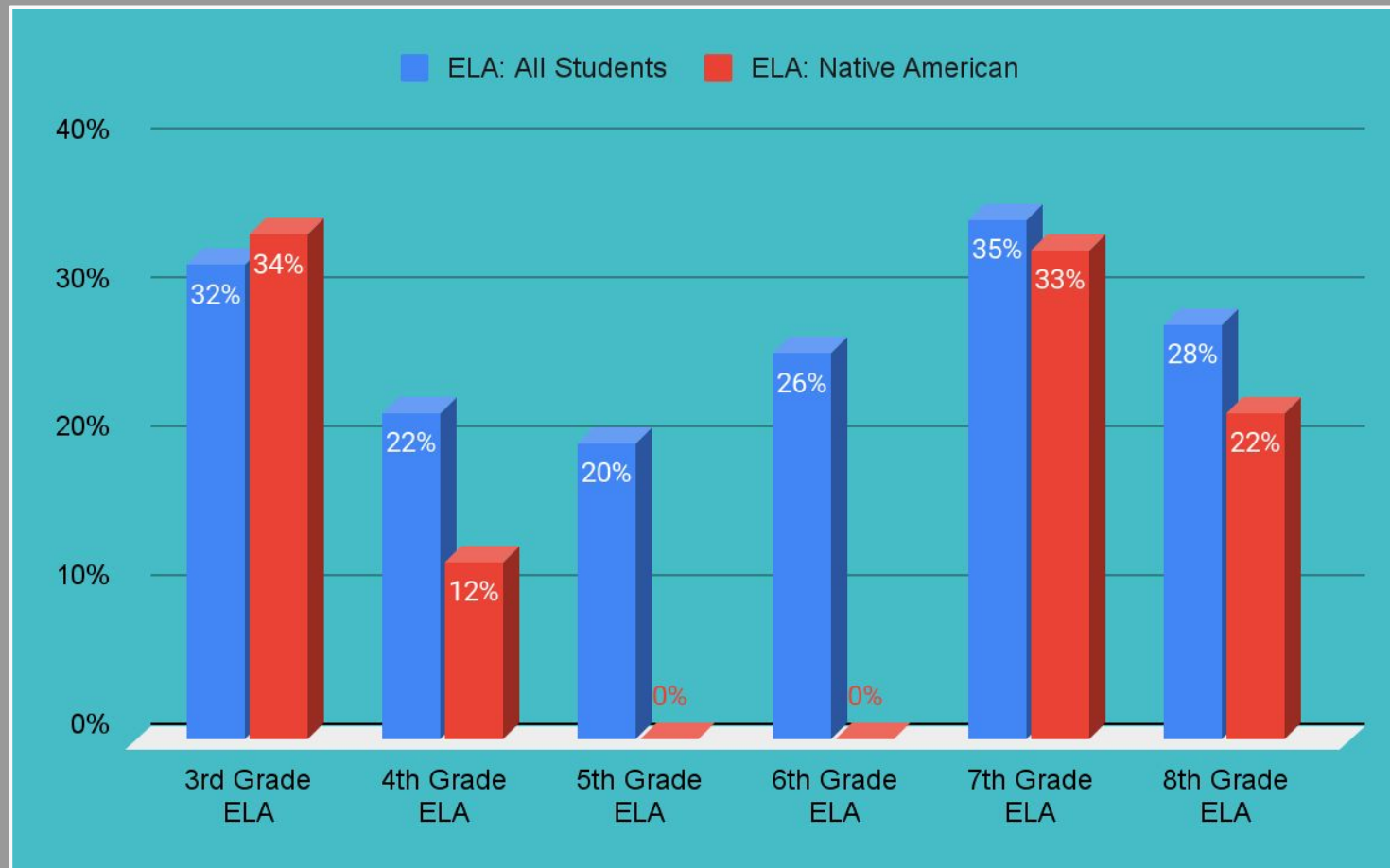
Native American Assessment Data Discrepancies

When disaggregating Native American Assessment Data, the State Department of Education utilizes the “ethnicity” marked on student enrollments to identify Native American student scores, instead of using the students who the district have coded as Indian Education eligible. The difference in these numbers is astounding and greatly impacts the validity of the comparison data we presented in the following slides.



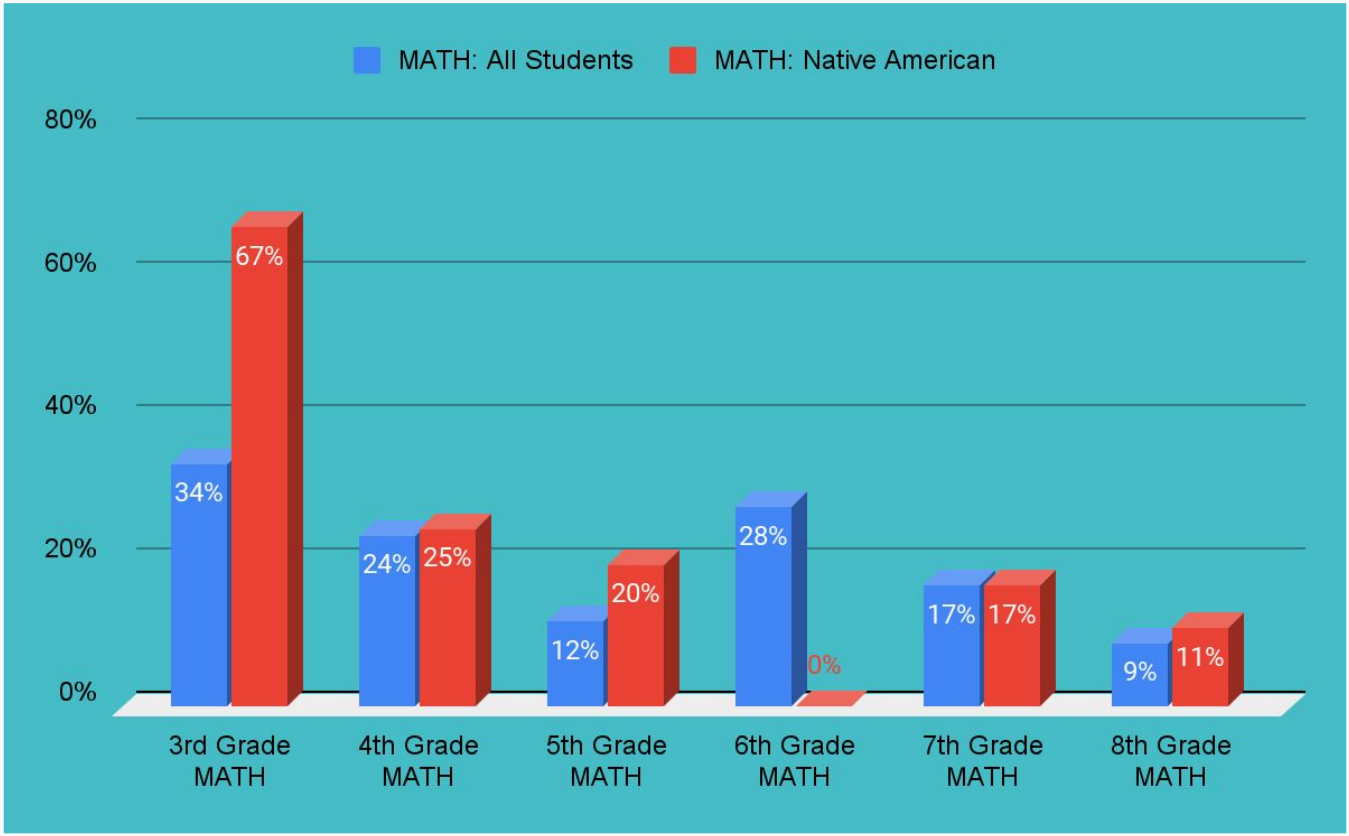

Passing English Language Arts – Spring 2023



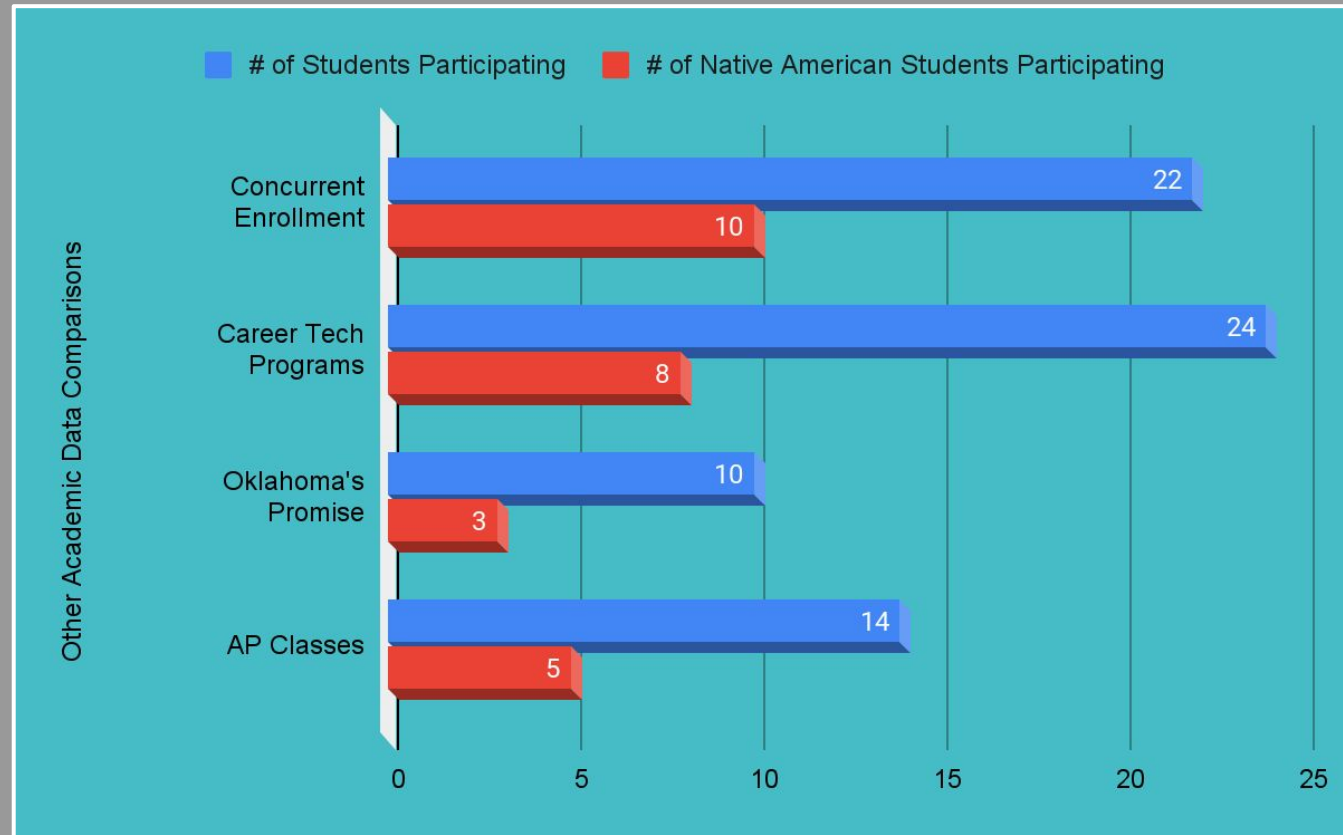
Student Assessment Data

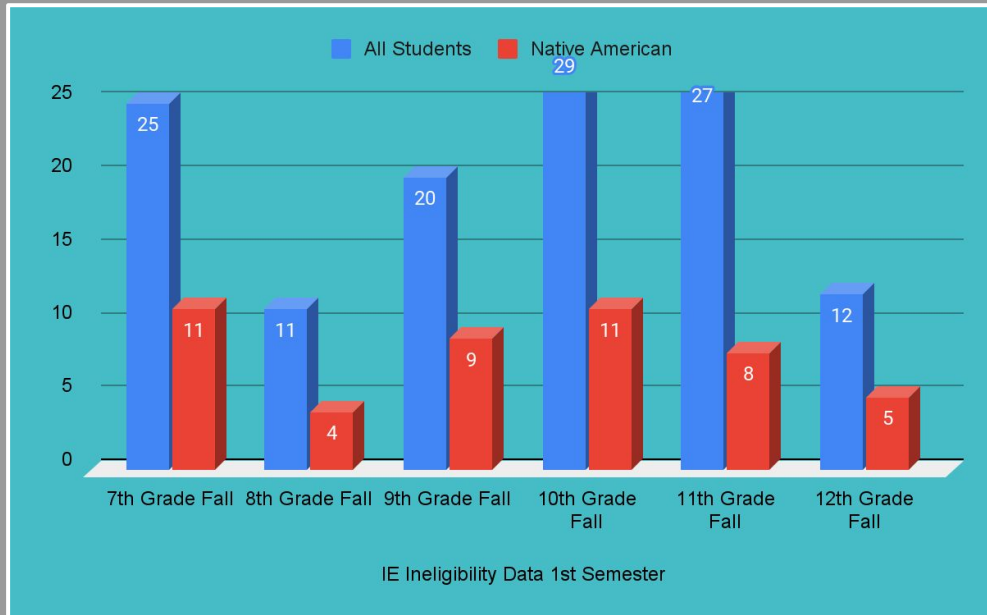

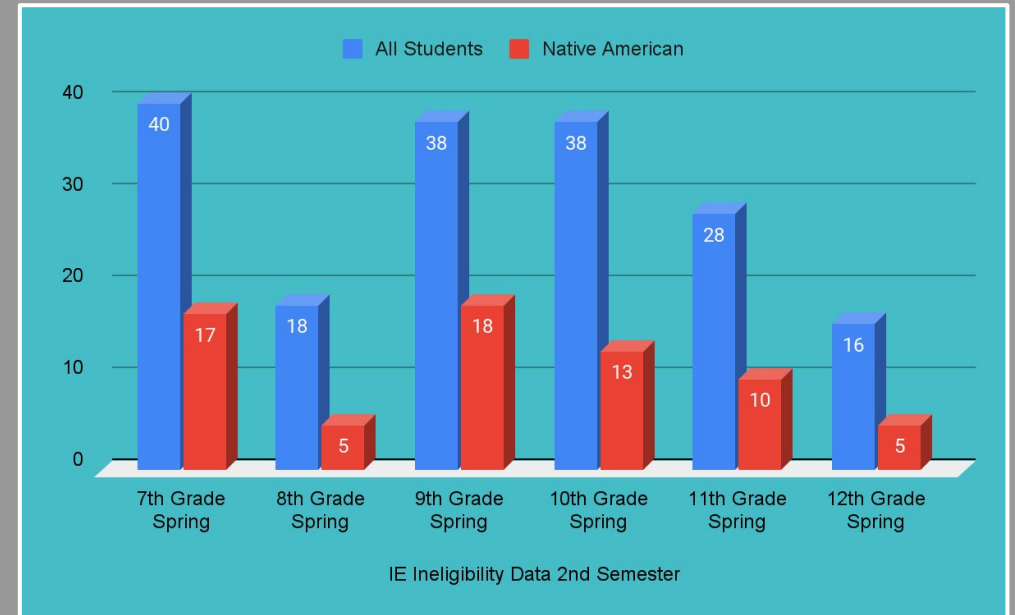

1st Semester, Fall 2022

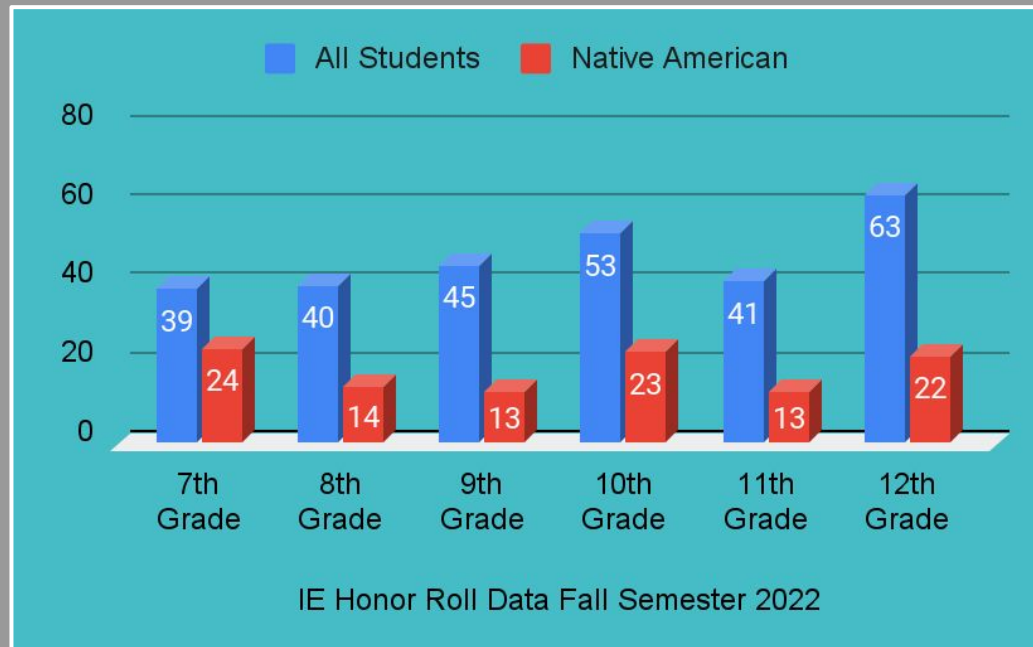


2nd Semester, Spring 2023

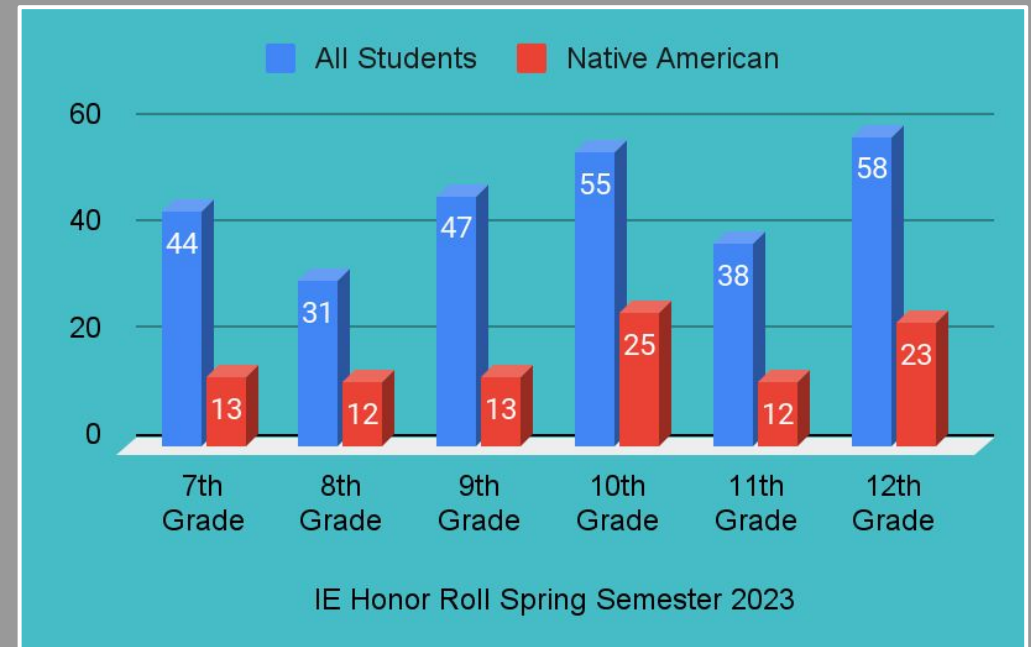
